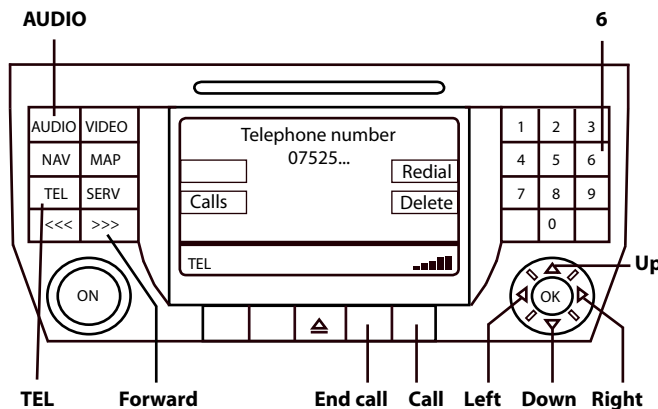


Mercedes Command Bluetooth quick start guide

This guide provides you with all the information you need to make and receive handsfree phone calls with your Mercedes Command radio and Dension BTA 1500 module.

You will need to have a Dension Gateway 500 and BTA 1500 correctly installed in and configured for your vehicle. Refer to the relevant Dension user manuals for basic controls. These are the buttons on your Command system you will use:



1 Pairing your phone and Command radio

Before you start, make sure your vehicle's radio is switched on and your phone's Bluetooth has been activated (check your phone's user manual for details).

Now you need to 'pair' your phone with your radio. Here's how to do it:

1. Press the **AUDIO** button on your Command radio and select **CDC** to enter **CD changer mode**
2. Press **6**. The Command display will show **Menu** at the top and **Source** in the centre
3. Hold **Forward** to select. The display will now show **Aux GW**
4. Use the **Up** and **Down** buttons to scroll through the options again until you reach **BT Audio**. Hold **Forward** to select
5. Use the **Up** and **Down** buttons to scroll again until you reach **Pairing**. There will be a beep and **In Progress** will appear onscreen
6. Now search for Bluetooth devices on your phone (check your phone's user manual for details) and select **Dension-BTA** when it appears. Use passkey **0000** to connect

When connection is complete, you will see your phone's name on the bottom right corner of Command screen and on your cluster display.

You are now ready to make and receive calls from your Command radio using the Command or steering wheel controls.

2 Making calls

1. Press the **TEL** button first and then dial the number using the number keys on your Command radio
2. Press the **Call** button to make the call. To finish the call, press **End call**. You can also use the buttons on your steering wheel (see your Command user manual for details)

4 Receiving calls

Receiving a call is the same as making a call. Use the **Call** button to take a call and the **End call** button to end a call. Your display will show the number or the name of the caller if you have them stored as a contact in your phonebook (see section 5). Again, you can also use your steering wheel controls.

5 Accessing your phonebook

You can press the **TEL** button followed by the **Phonebook** button (this will be indicated on your screen) to choose contacts from your phonebook. Contacts will be displayed on screen. Simply select a contact and press **Call**.

The first time you pair your phone, it may take up to 10 minutes to download your phonebook to the radio. Every time you reconnect your phone, the radio will look for any updates to your phonebook before allowing you to make calls. This should only take a short time but it will depend on the number of updates you have made.

Refer to your car's user manual for more details about the phone controls on your Command radio.
